Top Tips

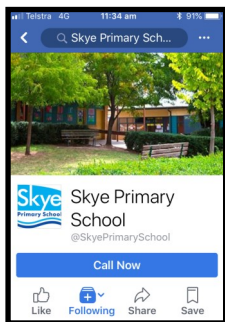
- 1. Routines.** Try to keep a routine in each household. Kids like rules and structure, it creates a predictable environment and will help to support the new living arrangements.
