Schools provide students with free instruction to fulfil the standard Victorian Curriculum and we want to assure you that all contributions are voluntary. However, the ongoing support of our families ensures that our Skye Primary School can continue to maintain the high standards that our community expects and allows us to offer the best possible education and support for our students. We want to thank you for all your support, whether that's through fundraising or volunteering your time. This has made a huge difference to our school, academic achievements and the programs we can offer.

Within our school this support and the continued generosity of the Skye Primary School community has allowed us to:

- Refurbish the Prep Patch building to convert a previously open planned learning space into four individual classrooms.
- Refurbish the BER building to build two additional classrooms and therapy rooms at each end to accommodate enrolment growth.
- Upgrade existing classroom spaces with new carpet, painting and furniture.
- Employ part time landscaping and maintenance contractors. Your voluntary contribution enhances the ongoing maintenance and upkeep of the school grounds.
- Ongoing purchase, installation and maintenance of split system units across the school.
- Purchase additional banks of digital devices such as laptops and iPads to ensure students have regular access to the latest learning technologies.
- Continual resourcing and restocking of literacy books and library books.

We strive to develop our student's personal and social skills, inspiring and empowering them to become confident, resilient, and valued members of the community. Financial Support for Families

Skye Primary School understands that some families may experience financial difficulty and offers a range of support options, including:

- Camps, Sports, Excursion Fund (CSEF) provides payments for eligible students to attend camps, sports and excursions. Families holding a valid means-tested concession card or temporary foster parents are eligible to apply and a Special Consideration eligibility category also exists.
- Access to State Schools Relief support for clothing / uniforms (via school)
- Second hand uniform
- Individual Payment Plans

FREE INSTRUCTION

- Schools provide students with free instruction and ensure students have free access to all items, activities and services that are used by the school to fulfil the requirements of the Curriculum. This includes the Victorian Curriculum F-10, the Victorian Certificate of Education (VCE) including the VCE Vocational Major and the Victorian Pathways Certificate.
- Schools may invite parents to make a financial contribution to support the school.



PARENT PAYMENT REQUESTS

Schools can request contributions from parents under three categories:

Curriculum Contributions

Voluntary financial contributions for curriculum items and activities which the school deems necessary for students to learn the Curriculum.

Other Contributions

Voluntary financial contributions for non-curriculum items and activities that relate to the school's functions and objectives.

Extra-Curricular Items and Activities

Items and activities that enhance or broaden the schooling experience of students and are above and beyond what the school provides for free to deliver the Curriculum. These are provided on a user-pays basis.

- Schools may also invite parents to supply or purchase educational items to use and own (e.g. textbooks, stationery, digital devices).



FINANCIAL HELP FOR FAMILIES

- Schools put in place financial hardship arrangements to support families who cannot pay for items or activities so that their child doesn't miss out.
- Schools have a nominated parent payment contact person(s) that parents can have a confidential discussion with regarding financial hardship arrangements.



SCHOOL PROCESSES

- Schools must obtain school council approval for their parent payment arrangements and publish all requests and communications for each year level on their school website for transparency.
